


New trails at North Unit

Cherokee Marsh Conservation Park's North Unit has two new trails to explore.

The South HIII trail takes you to the top of a drumlin and offers fantastic views the wetlands to the north and east. This trail is located on the southeast side of the trail system. The surface is still a little rough compared to the established trails.

The second new trail is an unnamed spur at the north end of the trail system. The spur ends at the boundary with the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) Cherokee Marsh Fishery Area. The Fishery Area extends north along the upper Yahara River and Token Creek and borders Dane County lands to the north. The Fishery Area has no established trails and you may walk anywhere within it, but be mindful of your location and take care not to stray onto bordering private land.

Queen rusty-patched bumblebee spotted

In August, Mary Binkley spotted this queen rusty patched bumblebee at Cherokee Marsh Conservation Park's South Unit. (The queen has no rusty patch.) The sighting was <u>confirmed</u> by the Wisconsin Bumblebee Brigade, a citizen-based monitoring project coordinated by the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources. Rusty patched bumblebees are listed as Endangered under the Endangered Species Act.

Land Steward training

This training is for anyone interested in taking a leadership role in restoration work at Yahara Heights, the Cherokee Marsh Natural Resource Area, or other Dane County lands.

Dane County Parks Natural Areas staff are hosting another <u>Certified Land Steward Orientation</u>.

Thurs, October 19, 8:45am - 3:30pm.

This orientation, along with our <u>Natural Areas Program Volunteer</u> <u>Handbook</u> empowers volunteers who want to take a leadership role as a Certified Land Steward to help manage a natural area within a <u>Dane County</u> <u>Park</u>.

With guidance from staff, Certified Land Stewards plan, organize, and conduct restoration work in the parks without direct on-site staff supervision. The orientation provides an overview of the Dane County Parks' Natural Areas Program, covers important policies and procedures, reviews herbicide safety, and orients volunteers to the assortment of tools and resources available to them for working safely and efficiently in the parks.

If you're interested in conducting a variety of ecological restoration activities (such as invasive brush and weed removal/treatment, native seed collection, herbicide application, etc.) in our parks, this training is for you.
